

Broadband Equity Access and Deployment (BEAD) Program Infrastructure Deployment Phase

The BEAD Program aims to provide universal broadband access and support digital equity initiatives. Massachusetts was awarded \$147 million through the federal BEAD Program to ensure all Broadband Serviceable Locations (BSLs) across the state have access to high-speed, reliable broadband. This program will fund infrastructure projects to connect unserved and underserved BSLs and enable Massachusetts to achieve its goal of 100% universal service through reliable broadband technology at speeds of at least 100/20 Mbps.



Eligibility BEAD Deployment Phase

Project Service Areas will initially be defined by municipality.

The following entities may apply for BEAD grants:

- » Private companies (e.g., corporations, limited liability companies, general partnerships, limited partnerships, etc.)
- » Local governmental entities (e.g., municipalities or municipal light plants that offer broadband service)
- » Tribal governments
- » Nonprofit organizations
- » Co-operatives, electric co-operatives, and public or private utilities
- » Public utility districts
- » Public-private partnerships, which are long-term agreements between local government entities and private entities for the delivery and funding of broadband services
- » Other entities that develop and/or operate broadband networks and can demonstrate the experience, capacity and financial resources and stability to satisfy the grant obligations

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Program Requirements

Organizations who anticipate applying for funding must have already completed the Pre-Qualification Process. Applicants pre-approved by MBI may proceed directly to submit the full project application.

Applications will be evaluated on the following criteria:

- » Provides a 25% match
- » Commitment to provide affordable broadband service
- » Compliance with federal fair labor laws
- » Ability to provide service to project area within four years
- » Speed of network and other technical capabilities
- » Ability to serve Community Anchor Institutes (CAIs)
- » Ability to offer low-cost plans
- » Ability to serve Multi Dwelling Units (MDUs) at the enterprise level
